WHO COOKS FOR YOU?? WHO-HOO!

Fall and Winter in South Florida is prime owl-spotting season!
Let's get familiar with the three major tree-dwelling owls you can find.

The smallest owl is the Eastern Screech Owl (*Megascops asio*). Standing only 6–10 inches tall, with a weight of 4.2 to 8.6 ounces, and a wingspan of 18–24 inches, these tiny owls are masters of camouflage and are difficult to spot. Their calls are trills and whinnies. You can see a captive Screech Owl named “Owliver” at the nature center at Green Cay Wetlands.

The Barred Owl (*Strix varia*) is twice the size of the Screech Owl, with a height of 16–25 inches, a weight of 1.1 to 2.5 pounds, and a wingspan of 3.3 to 4.3 feet. They give the famous “Who cooks for you” call.

The largest of all is the Great Horned Owl (*Bubo virginianus*), weighing 2 to 5.5 pounds, with a wingspan of 3.3 to 4.8 feet, standing 18–25 inches tall. Their calls are booming “Hoo-hoo”s.

Their hunting prowess earns them the nickname “tigers of the night sky.”

Screech Babies

All owls are raptors, with powerful talons and specialized feathers that allow them to fly silently. They prey on rodents, rabbits, insects, fish, and birds (even other owls!). Owls swallow their prey whole, when small enough, and expel indigestible bits (fur, bones) in an owl pellet. Most owls nest here beginning in January and through March. The owlets can be seen near the nest when they “branch” prior to learning how to fly. Lucky owl-spotters will enjoy seeing them while they cannot fly away.



Finding owls requires patience and good hearing and eyesight. Luckily, smaller birds like Blue Jays will often “mob” owls, and if you follow them and their hysterical calls, you may luck into an owl sighting! I have seen all three of these owls at Green Cay Wetlands and at Arthur Marshall Loxahatchee NWR. Before the loss of trees at our neighboring Palm Greens, I had a Great Horned Owl on my roof!! Good luck spotting one.

Next time, we'll explore the South Florida owls that are not dependent on trees – Barn Owls and Burrowing Owls.

The deadline for installing the new mailboxes is approaching on December 31, 2025. Beginning January 15, 2026, fines can be assessed for any homeowner who has not completed the replacement. Although the Delray Beach Green Market (now marking its 30th anniversary on Saturdays, 9AM-2 PM) offers fresh, tempting produce and organic meats, you still might ask, "Why go to a green market if I can shop right here at The Boys?" A fair question, so here's my answer:


Take-Home Beauties

Most of the 70-plus vendors at the market aren't even farmers. Instead, they're mom-and-pop bakeries, bottlers, and such.

My faves? Tennessee Bob's Hot Sauce, Pemba Foods Caribbean hot sauces, and Pit Bull BBQ Sauce. Visit Dr. Pickle (products include hard-to-find pickles and kraut that are fermented, not just jarred with vinegar), the Concord Grape Pie Company (one of their treats is Cutie Pie, and it is), Eddie's Dark Chocolate (dark, darker, and darkest), Mond Epice (especially for its exotic spice blends), Starz Bakery (bagels, bialys, rugelach), and Killer Coffee. And then there are gluten-free and vegan products: G(u)ilty Bakery's chocolate chip cookies, Sun Goddess Vegan Soup, Vegan Mario's Gluten-Free breads (including pricey but authentic sourdoughs), Casapan Gluten-Free Breads (try the coconut), and European Gourmet Bakery (ciabatta, baba ganoush), Farmers Market Honey's Intensive Skin Care Cream and even a pet adoption service.

Eating Outdoors

An open-air food court features picnic tables conducive to chatting with other attendees, a good band that's not too loud (yay!), and food vendors such as La Paella Chef (tender shrimp and saffron rice steaming in massive pans), a Haitian-American stall whose biggest surprise is luscious gluten-free waffles, Peruvian Ceviche (the classics and some with fruits), an empanada stand with both traditional and creative empanadas (e.g. a Reuben!), Real Maryland Crabcakes, Marty Schecht Tex-Mex, Pasta Amore (16 choices), and A Taste of Africa, whose fire-grilled chicken is scrumptious, and they also make the best cheese arepas on earth. Bring a bag; take some home.



Healthy Habits to Support Your Immune System

Nourish Your Body with a Balanced Diet Food is the foundation of immune health. Nutrients from whole foods provide the building blocks your immune system needs to function properly.

- Fruits and vegetables: Packed with vitamins (like C and A), minerals, and antioxidants that help immune cells fight off invaders.
- Lean proteins: Sources such as poultry, fish, beans, lentils, and tofu support the production of antibodies and repair tissues.
- Healthy fats: Omega-3 fatty acids from salmon, walnuts, and flaxseeds can reduce inflammation and support cell membranes.
- Whole grains: Oats, brown rice, and quinoa provide fiber, which fuels beneficial gut bacteria.
- Stay hydrated: Water transports nutrients, flushes out waste, and keeps mucous membranes moist.
- Eat fermented foods (yogurt with live cultures, kefir, sauerkraut, kimchi, miso)

Prioritize Quality Sleep

Sleep is not just downtime. While you sleep, your body produces and releases immune cells and proteins called cytokines which help fight infections. Adults should aim for 7–9 hours of quality sleep per night.

Manage Stress

Ongoing tension makes your body more vulnerable to illness. Reduce stress by:

- Daily movement (walks, yoga, stretching).

- Hobbies that bring joy, such as music, gardening, or reading.



THE HOT WATER HEATER

A major component integral to any residence is the hot water heater. Since electricity is the major source of energy in South Florida, most hot water heaters are powered by electricity. Hot water heaters come in two basic varieties--the storage tank heater and the tankless water heater. This article will discuss the storage tank type. In the Spring issue of The Grapevine we will discuss the tankless heater and the pros and cons of each type.

Below is a picture of a basic tank type water heater. The tank comes in various capacities, but most commonly used in our size residences are 30 or 40 gallon tanks. The heater has an upper and lower submersible electric heating element. These heating elements have integral thermostats to control water temperature. The upper thermostat also has an overtemp safety control. The thermostats are adjustable to control water temperature in the storage tank and are usually adjusted to 120-140 degrees F to avoid burns from scalding hot water. There is an additional safety pressure/temp control on the top of the tank should the water become super heated or at elevated pressure. This control will release water until the temperature or pressure is at a safe level. The cold water pipe entering the tank extends to the bottom of the tank. Hot water exits the tank at the top of the tank.



As the hot water is used, cold water enters the tank to replace the hot water being used. This reduces the temperature of the water in the tank until the water temperature supplied is not satisfactory or as noted, "we ran out of hot water." During this process the electric heating elements have been activated to reheat the water.

The time it takes to reheat the water is known as the recovery time. As a rule of thumb it takes one hour to raise 20 gallons of incoming water from 60 degrees F to 120 degrees F. Therefore storage tank water heaters are not suitable for large demands of hot water.

The electric service for the 30 or 40 gallon hot water heater is usually a 30 amp, 240 volt circuit. You will see a 2 pole circuit breaker in the circuit breaker panel dedicated to the hot water heater.

This circuit breaker can be identified by its large size and noted ampere rating.

Bring a beach towel and consider a terrycloth robe too in the winter when the air is cooler. Bring a bottle of water. Trust me, you'll be so thirsty.

Cardio benefits the heart and lungs, strengthens bones, muscles, and the immune system, and helps with weight reduction. It also reduces stress, lowers cholesterol and high blood pressure, tones and tightens both the upper and lower body, and strengthens abdominal muscles.

Blueberry Muffin Top Cake

This recipe is to honor the memory of Greg Donahue and is written in the style that Greg would have made it!



For the Muffin Top Cake: In a mixer cream together 1 1/2 sticks of butter, and 1 1/4 cups of sugar. Then beat in 4 eggs. Slowly add 2 1/4 cups of flour, 1 TBS baking soda, a TBS of vanilla, and a little cinnamon. Then mix in 1 1/2 cups of sour cream or plain yogurt. Now gently fold in 4 cups of blueberries. Pour the batter into a greased 12"x12"x2" pan.

For the Crumb Topping: Wisk together 1 1/2 sticks of butter, 1/2 sugar, and 1/2 cup brown sugar. Add 1 3/4 cups flour, and 1 tsp. cinnamon. Use your hands to form a crumbly ball

of dough. Break up the dough into uneven clumps and scatter evenly over the batter.

Bake for about 25 minutes in a preheated 350 degree oven. An inserted toothpick should come out clean. Let cool for 15 minutes before slicing.


